The following **foods** may be dangerous if ingested by your pet:

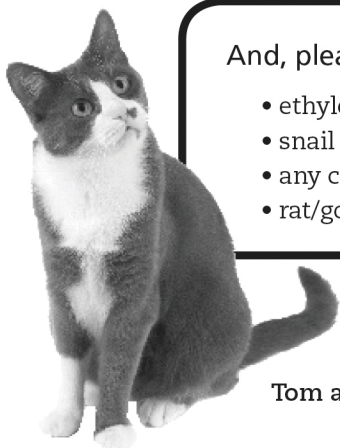

| • Alcoholic beverages | • Chocolate | • Peach pits |
| • Alfalfa | • Coffee (<i>grounds, beans, chocolate covered espresso beans</i>) | • Potato leaves and stems (<i>green parts</i>) |
| • Almond seeds | • Grapes | • Raisins |
| • Apple seeds | • Hops (<i>used in home beer brewing</i>) | • Rhubarb leaves |
| • Apricot pits | • Macadamia nuts | • Salt |
| • Avocados—toxic to birds, mice, rabbits, horses, cattle, and dairy goats | • Moldy foods | • Tea (<i>caffeine</i>) |
| • Candy containing the sweetener Xylitol | • Mushroom plants | • Tomato leaves and stems (<i>green parts</i>) |
| • Cherry pits | • Mustard seeds | • Walnuts |
| | • Onions and onion powder | • Yeast dough |
