BEHAVIOR SERVICES OFFERED BY PHS/SPCA

PHS/SPCA has a variety of animal behavior resources available to help you address any training or other behavior issues you might be having with your pet. Some of our services are free while others are offered for a fee.

PET FOOD BANK

Our Pet Food Bank helps cat and dog owners in San Mateo County who need assistance to feed their pets. The food bank occurs monthly on the 2nd Friday of each month in Burlingame. Participants must register in advance and self-certify that they are low-income and/or experiencing financial hardship. LOW-COST VETERINARY MEDICAL SERVICES

Our low-cost Vaccination Clinic provides vaccinations for cats and dogs of all ages. We offer rabies, canine influenza, and DHPP vaccinations for dogs and rabies, FeLV and FVRCP vaccinations for cats. The Vaccination Clinic is held by appointment only the 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month and the 2nd Wednesday of the month.
