CAT-ober adoption promotion
*Peninsula Humane Society & SPCA waives adoption fees
for all cats six months or older*

Burlingame, CA---The Peninsula Humane Society & SPCA (PHS/SPCA) is hosting a cat adoption promotion called CAT-ober to help find homes for the abundance of felines at their shelter in Burlingame. Adoption fees are waived on all cats aged six months or older at the shelter through the end of October.

“Cats are simply wonderful, and we have more than 68 cats available for adoption,” said PHS/SPCA’s Communications Manager Buffy Martin Tarbox. “Ready to learn from a pro how to hiss less and purr more? Then adopt a cat from us!”

Peninsula Humane Society & SPCA has all kinds of cats waiting for their new homes, including a bonded 13-year-old male senior pair named Hops and Barley.

“All of our cats are spayed or neutered, microchipped and vaccinated,” according to Tarbox. “And if you want a kitten, we’ve loads of them too for an adoption fee of \$120.”

Adoptable cats are available at PHS/SPCA Tom and Annette Lantos Center for Compassion at 1450 Rollins Road, Burlingame. The shelter is open for adoptions 11:00 a.m. to 6 p.m. seven days a week. Potential adopters should arrive at least an hour before closing time to complete an adoption.

“Even though the adoption fees are waived on all our cats aged six months or older, we will still be following our strict and rigorous adoption processes since we want to make permanent matches,” according to Tarbox.
