

Lucky ducklings rescued

A Midtown Palo Alto resident spotted four ducklings crossing Middlefield Road, corralled them into a carport and called Animal Control Officer Cody Macartney for help.

The rest of the family was nowhere to be found in a nearby creek, so Macartney brought the ducklings on April 22 to the Peninsula Humane Society's wildlife center in Saratoga, where they were fed duck crumble and fresh greens three times a day, spokeswoman Colleen Crowley said.

The ducklings were weighed and examined every day for a week. They swam in a pool and had good appetites, so they were brought to an animal sanctuary outside of Chico, where they'll grow up and be released, Crowley said.
